

PROSPECT HEIGHTS UNIVERSALIST CHURCH.
Arrangements Made to Move
Into a New Meeting Place Next October

Prospect Heights Universalist Church, Rev. James Taylor, pastor, have made arrangements to change their place of meeting in order to accommodate their increasing membership. Since last October they have worshiped in a store at the corner of Sixth avenue and Tenth street. A meeting was held last Monday by the society, President J. W. Stillwell, Jr., in the chair, at which arrangements were perfected for a two years' lease of a hall at the corner of Seventh avenue and Eighth street, which is now in course of erection and which will be ready for occupancy by the church on or before the first of next October. It will seat, when furnished, about three hundred, and it will be called Chapin's Hall, after the New York clergyman of that name [Rev. Edwin H. Chapin]. The congregation of Prospect Heights Universalist Church now numbers about twenty-five families.
