MAN AND WIFE JOINT PASTORS

The Rev. Mr. and Mrs. Wright Give Up Their Brooklyn Charge

The Prospect Heights Universalist Church of Brooklyn is soon to lose its distinction of being the only church in the city with a joint pastorate filled by a man and his wife. The Revs. A. E. and Alice K. Wright, the joint pastors of the church, have resigned, and expect to leave Brooklyn in the near future. Their resignations, however, have not yet been accepted, the members of the church being loth to part with them. Mr. and Mrs. Wright feel that their present charge offers attractive opportunities for a single pastor, but that the field is scarcely large enough for two pastors. They do not know as yet just where they will go when they leave Brooklyn.

Mr. and Mrs. Wright were students together in the theological seminary attached to St. Lawrence University. They were married immediately after their graduation. Their first charge was the Morrisville (Vt.) Universalist Church, whence they came to Brooklyn seven years ago to take pastoral charge of the North Henry Street Universalist Society. Two years ago they took charge of the Prospect Heights Church. They have been very successful in their work there.
