Genoa	by 6 Oct 1830, when it was admitted to the Cayuga Ass'n. of Universalists <i>(Evangelical Magazine & Gospel Advocate, Utica NY, 30 Oct 1830)</i>		A church was dedicated on 29 Jul 1830 and was believed to be "the first and only Meeting House built by Universalists alone" in Cayuga County. <i>(Evangelical Magazine & Gospel Advocate, Utica NY, 7 Aug 1830)</i>
Kelloggsville (First Universalist Society in Niles)	by 27 Sep 1843, when it was admitted to the Cayuga Ass'n. of Universalists <i>(Evangelical Magazine & Gospel Advocate, Utica NY, 13 Oct 1843)</i>	In Jun 1864 the Cayuga Ass'n. of Universalists reported that "the society seems to be doing nothing." <i>(Christian Ambassador, New York NY, 11 Jun 1864)</i>	A church was under construction by Apr 1842. <i>(Evangelical Magazine & Gospel Advocate, Utica NY, 15 Apr 1842)</i> It was dedicated on 10 Jul 1843. <i>(Evangelical Magazine & Gospel Advocate, Utica NY, 5 Aug 1843)</i>
Scipio (Universalist Society of Venice and Scipio, per NYSCU Parish Roll)	by 23 Sep 1836, when its formation was reported <i>(Herald of Truth, Geneva, 23 Sep 1836)</i> ; also it was incorporated that year (NYSCU Parish Roll)	after 1913; it was still a member of the Convention that year	A new brick meeting house was dedicated on 12 Jun 1839 <i>(Evangelical Magazine & Gospel Advocate, Utica NY, 1 Nov 1839)</i> . The building was acquired by the Convention on 7 Jan 1915 <i>(Empire State Universalist, Oct 1921)</i> and sold in 1939 to the Masonic order. (NYSCU Parish Roll)
