A Universalist church was built [at Lakeville] in 1838 and 1839, although the society was organized about 1831. It was built of stone and erected just west of the driveway leading to Carnes Park where the Caverly Hot Dog stand is now located. It was dedicated in 1840 and lasted less than 10 years. The Rev. Roberts was the first preacher. The first trustees were Robert Adams, John Farrell, and George Smith.
