Proceedings will soon be commenced by the members of the Universalist society of Malone to enable the society to sell the lot and church building on West Main street, next to the M. E. church. If the sale is made the proceeds will be turned over to the St. Lawrence university at Canton, which is in its theological department controlled by the Universalist society. It is probable that the Methodist society will buy the lot for a parsonage. It is to be regretted that the Universalist society is not strong enough here to maintain services and t keep its church property occupied. During the pastorate of the Rev. Mr. Crehore, the last resident clergyman of that denomination, the services were always interesting and were well attended, although the expenses of the church necessarily fell upon a few.
