Universalist Church

In 1815 the Universalists built a house in Moravia, where for a time they met for religious exercises; but the building was afterward used as a dwelling house, and no other was erected. It is believed that this Society adhered to the former doctrine and belief above mentioned [of Universalism]. They occasionally held meetings in the village, but no church was established [e.g. only a society].

Quite a number of this faith have resided here but have generally attended the other churches.
