### THE SIXTH SOCIETY

The Sixth Universalist Society of this city (Rev. Mr. Brooks) which sold its church last spring, and has since that date worshipped in the Everett Rooms, corner [of] Broadway and 34th street, has, we are rejoiced to learn, purchased a church with the parsonage attached, on 35<sup>th</sup> street, between the 5th and 6th Avenues. The church has for the past few years been occupied by the Episcopal "Church of the Resurrection." The Society comes into possession the 18th of February; but contemplates improvements and adornments, which will defer occupancy until about the first Sunday in March. We congratulate our brethren of the Sixth Society on again finding a home—on the peculiar joy of worshipping in a church consecrated to sacred uses. We also congratulate the pastor on finding a home in the very convenient parsonage. The Society thus anchored will feel renewed confidence, and work in still greater faith. The result must be set down as a substantial advance in the history of Universalism in New York city.
