

THIS INDENTURE, made the 20th day of August, One Thousand Nine Hundred and thirty-five, between The Universalist Church and Society of Nunda, New York, a religious corporation organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, andlocated in the Village of Nunda, Livingston County, New York, party of the first part, and the New York State Convention of Universalists, a religious corporation organized and existing under Chapter 188 of the Laws of the State of New York of 1862 as amended, party of the second part,

WHEREAS, the party of the first part is a church of the Universalist denomination of the State of New York in fellowship with the party of the second part, and

WHEREAS, as a regular parish meeting of the party of the first part held at the usual place, namely, in the church edifice in the Village of Nunda, Livingston County, New York, after public written notice of such meeting signed by the parish clerk and specifying the place and time of such meeting had been duly given by posting three copies of said notice in conspicuous places in said Village of Nunda, New York, for ten days prior to the time of said meeting, this conveyance is duly authorized by a majority vote of the parish of said Church,

NOW, THEREFORE, THIS INDENTURE WITNESSETH that the party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00), lawful money of the United States, and other good and valuable considerations paid by the party of the second part, and pursuant to the provisions of Sections 7 and 9 of Chapter 188 of the laws of 1862, as amended, does hereby grant and release unto the party of the second part, its successors and assigns forever,

<sup>&</sup>quot;ALL THAT TRACT OR PARCEL OF LAND situate in the Village of Nunda, County of Livingston and State of New York, being a part of Lot No. 29 of the Tuscarora Tract; beginning in the center of East Street in the said Village at a point twelve feet west of a continuation of the west line of the Universalist brick church building, and running thence northerly and parallel with said line and twleve feet west therefrom to the south line of the lot upon which the shed of the Presbyterian Church and Society stands; thence east on said south line to the west line of the lot upon which the Presbyterian Church stands; thence southerly to the center of East Street on the west line of the said lot upon which said Presbyterian Church stands; thence westerly along the center of East Street to the place of beginning, being the lot upon which the new brick Universalist Church is erected.

Also the right to occupy and use a lane twelve feet in width adjoining the above described premises on the west and extending from the center of East Street to a point thirty feet north of the main building of said church edifice, and to run parallel to the west line of said church lot.

Said lane is to be occupied and used by the party of the second part jointly with the owners and occupants of the adjoining lot on the west thereof.

Also another piece or parcel of land in said Village and described as follows: viz, beginning at a point where the west line of said lot No. 29 of the Tuscarora Tract crosses East Street and leginning thence easterly in the center of East Street, to a point four feed east from a continuation of the east line of the Union Hall building, and running thence northerly and parallel with the said East line of said hall and four feet therefrom to a point where it strikes said west line of said lot No. 29 of said Tuscarora Tract; thence southerly to the place of beginning on said west line of Lot. No. 29 of said Tract.

The parties entitled to use and occupy said lane shall jointly make and maintain a gate thereto on East Street of a style to conform to the fence in front of the Universalist Church!

## its successors

The grantor will receive the consideration for this conveyance and will hold the right to receive such consideration as trust fund to be applied first for the purpose of paying the cost of any improvement, that has been commenced upon the premises and has not been completed at least four months before the making and recording of this deed, and that the grantor will apply the same first to the payment of the cost of improvement before using any part of the total of the same for any other purposes.


