A Social Circle has also been formed in connection with this new enterprise, and is full of life and courage, and already abounds in deeds of kindness, as the pastor's winter outfit for sleigh-riding bears witness. In the meantime the Sunday School of the church proper suffers no decline either in numbers or interest. The promise of a second church in Rochester grows stronger every hour.
