DIED.

CROWE.—Suddenly, on Tuesday, Dec. 15, 1914, in New York City, Winfield S. Crowe, D.D., in his 65th year. Funeral private.

Rev. Dr. W. S. Crowe, who died in this city suddenly on the 15th inst., was a leading clergyman of the Universalist Church. He was pastor of the Church of the Redeemer at Newark, N.J., for thirteen years and made a profound impression upon the religious life of that community.

He was later for ten years pastor of the Church of Eternal Hope [Third Universalist] in this city, until his health failed several years since.

He had extraordinary force as a pulpit speaker, and was withal a ripe scholar, and distinguished in Shakespearian studies.

He came of a Virginia family, was born in Kentucky and spent his early life in Indiana. His wife and two sons survive him.
