Rev. Howard B. Gilman
Utica-Little Falls

The Reverend Howard Burbank Gilman, 82, formerly of Utica and Little Falls, died Sunday, November 22, 1992 at Loretta Rest in Syracuse.

He was born in Salem, Mass., son of Arthur and Lucy Burbank Gilman. He attended Salem schools and graduated from Tufts University and its Theological School in 1934. He served as minister of the Universalist Church in Little Falls from 1937-1953, and later from 1973-1980. While in Little Falls, he helped to found Unirondack, an educational institute and summer camp near Lowville and gave many years to the programs for young people there.

From 1953-1964, Rev. Gilman was the superintendent of the New York State Convention of Universalists and lived in Syracuse. Rev. Gilman was the representative of the Unitarian Universalist Service Committee to Nairobi, Kenya from 1964-1967, and was Office of International Relations Emissary to Japan for the Unitarian Universalist Association from 1968-1972. Rev. Gilman lived in Utica from 1983 until April of 1992.

He is survived by a cousin, Grafton Haskell, of Beverly, Mass., and many, many friends.

Friends are invited to attend a Memorial Service Saturday, December 12, at 1 p.m. at the First Universalist Society of Syracuse, 250 Waring Rd., Syracuse, with the Rev. Elizabeth Strong officiating. Interment will be in Harmony Grove Cemetery, Salem, Mass.
