The funeral will be held from the Universalist church, at 2:30 o'clock, Wednesday afternoon. Interment in our Rural cemetery.

## REV. A. L. PARTRIDGE

The following from the Rochester Times in a communication from Webster, N.Y., regarding the death of Rev. A. L. Partridge mentioned briefly last week, speaks in strong terms of his sincerity and singleness of purpose in his chosen calling.

The funeral of the Rev. A. L. Partridge took place this afternoon from the Universalist Church at two o'clock. Rev. Dr. Atwood, assisted by the Rev. Harry Wright of Corfu, officiated. The church was thronged with sorrowing friends of the deceased pastor.

Mr. Partridge was born at Edenton, St. Lawrence County, August 4, 1871, and resided there until his entrance into the ministry. He was graduated from the Canton Theological Seminary in Jun 1896. His first charges were at Bridgewater [Oneida Co.], Corfu [Genesee Co.], Upper Lisle [Broome Co.], respectively. He was a member of the Foresters and a Good Templar.

Mr. Partridge began his pastorate at Webster April 1, 1905. He was married in June of the same year to Miss Edith Gevena Corp of Corfu, N.Y. He did brilliant work in the church and Sunday School and his parishioners from the outset became attached to both him and Mrs. Partridge, who has wide spread sympathy in her bereavement. Throughout the community Mr. Partridge's death is regarded as a personal loss. He was always ready and willing to do anything to help a friend or to advance his church interest and was an ardent worker in the temperance cause.

Mr. Partridge leaves besides his wife, Mrs. Edith Partridge, his mother, Mrs. Laura A. Partridge; a sister, Miss Evangeline Partridge of Edenton, N.Y.; one brother, George H. Partridge, of New York City. Burial was in the Webster Rural Cemetery.
