REV. NOEL SPICER WAS BORN HERE

Born and Raised on Beach Hill and Once Owned and Occupied  
Present Home of His Brother, D. G. Spicer—Died August 8, 1941

The following in part is information sent us by Att'y. A. D. Jones of Lansing, Mich., which we have added to from information from the brother:

Rev. Noel Edward Spicer, aged 75 years, retired Universalist minister, passed away early Friday morning, August 8, 1941 at his residence, 3323 Roosevelt road, Kenosha, Wis., after a long illness.

He was born at Whitesville, N.Y., on March 8, 1866. He was a graduate of St. Lawrence Seminary at Canton, N.Y. His first pastorate was at LaPeer, Mich., in 1889, after which he was pastor of Universalist churches in Wisconsin, Illinois, Minnesota and Iowa. He retired from the ministry 12 years ago, coming to Kenosha later to make his home.

On Sept. 30, 1891 he was united in marriage to Marie Watts Rich, at LaPeer, Mich. He was a 32nd degree Mason, being a member of Halcyon R. A. Chapter No. 8, Rochester, Minn.

He is survived by one son Elton Rich Spicer of Chicago, two daughters, Mrs. R. L. Hollingworth of New York city and Miss Eudora Marie Spicer of Kenosha, also one brother, Daniel Grant Spicer of Beach Hill, near Whitesville, N.Y.

The body was taken from the Crossin Funeral Home to Graceland Cemetery, Chicago, Ill., Saturday morning for cremation. Burial was at LaPeer, Mich.

Rev. Spicer lived for a time in the home section and preached at times in the local Universalist Church. His last visit here was 20 some years ago, we learn from the family here.
