Clifton Springs, N. Y.—The residents of this village were deeply shocked yesterday forenoon to learn of the sudden death of Rev. Dr. Chas. W. Turrell. Although he had been in poor health during the past year, his condition was not thought to be critical and his death came very unexpectedly. For some time previous to his failing health, Dr. Turrell was the pastor of the local Universalist church, but had to give up the ministry on account of his health about two years ago, since which time he has not been able to preach. He is survived by his wife [Mary E. Turrell] of this village, and one son, of Tucson, Arizona, Prof. Charles A. Turrell, who is a professor in the University of Arizona at that place. The funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon at his late home on Broad street at 2 o'clock and will be conducted by Rev. M. C. Freeman, the rector of St. John's Episcopal church of this village. Dr. Turrell was a member of the Odd Fellows, having joined the order at LeRoy, Ill., his former home.
