L Aid TO REST

Funeral of the Late Rev. F. H. York Held
From the Family Home Yesterday Afternoon.

The funeral of the late Rev. Frank H. York was held from his residence, No. 706 Cedar avenue, yesterday afternoon. The services were under Niagara Frontier lodge No. 132, F. & A.M., officiating. Several clergymen of the Universalist faith were present, and took part in the religious ceremonies. The scripture reading was by the Rev. J. D. Corby of Buffalo, after which a prayer was offered by the Rev. A. L. Gross [Arthur Wilder Grose] of Rochester. The funeral sermon was delivered by the Rev. I. M. [Isaac Morgan] Atwood, D.D., of Rochester, and the services closed with a prayer by the Rev. F. [Franklin] F. Buckner of Middleport.

Frank Hinnan [sic] York was born Aug. 21st, 1855, at Maple Grove, Indiana. He entered Ann Arbor University at the age of 16 years. After completing the course at this university, he took a course in the Congregational Theological Seminary at Chicago. While a student at this school he supplied a pulpit at Bowmansville, a suburb of Chicago. At the close of his theological course he was ordained a minister of the Congregational faith at De Witt, Iowa, where he preached three years. At the close of his pastorate there he fellowshiped with the Universalist denomination, and has held pastorates at Moline, Ill., Oshkosh, Wis., Waterloo, Iowa, [and] Olcott, Lockport and Niagara Falls, N.Y. He has always taken a leading part in the work of his church, and his word of kind council [counsel] will be greatly missed among his past associates.

He married Addie Rishel of Cambridge, Ill., to whom has been born six children: Gleo, Nellie, Frank, Agnes, Carl and Clare, who are left to mourn the loss of a loving husband and kind father.
