JOHN ABBOTT DIED IN ST. PETERSBURG
Following Several Months of Serious Illness
NATIVE OF THIS LOCALITY
Born on Abbott Farm on West Side of Silver Lake—
Funeral Services on Friday

John Abbott, a highly esteemed and long time resident of this locality, died last Monday about noon at his home in St. Petersburg, Fla., where he has resided most of the time during the past 16 years.

The deceased was a son of Mr. and Mrs. James Abbott and was born on the homestead farm (now occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd Abbott) on the Oatka road, west of Silver Lake, on September 12, 1854. He grew to manhood there and in 1878 he was united in marriage to Miss Emeline Spencer of Castile, who survives him, together with their only son, Bert Abbott.

He is also survived by four brothers—Lloyd and Charles, of the west side of Silver Lake, Elmer J. and Luther G., of this village.

For many years Mr. Abbott resided on the farm now occupied by his son Bert, west of the lake, and was a man highly respected for his integrity and his genial personality. He was a member of the First Universalist Church of Perry.

The remains will arrive in Perry today and funeral services will be held on Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock at the home of his son, Bert, west of the lake. Rev. William J. Metz, pastor of the Universalist Church, will officiate, and interment will be made in Glenwood Cemetery in this village.
