GEO. W. ADAMS DIES SUDDENLY Expires 2 Hours After Entering Hospital STRICKEN BY HEMORRHAGE

Formerly President of Geo. W. Adams Company, Candy Manufacturers, But Had Recently Been Employed as a Salesman

George W Adams, 86, well known business man of 182 Bowers avenue, died suddenly at the House of the Good Samaritan Sunday evening at 9, just two hours after he entered the hospital.

Mr. Adams had been taken sick four days previous to his death. His condition became grave Sunday and he was taken to the hospital in an attempt to save his life. Death was caused by internal hemorrhage. He had been in perfect health until taken sick.

Mr. Adams was a native of this city, born Oct. 3, 1871, the son of George and Isabelle Skinner Adams. He lived here his entire life attending school and later entering business.

For a number of years Mr. Adams was in the candy business and was at one time president of the George W. Adams Company, Inc., candy manufacturer. The company went into bankruptcy in 1921. Recently Mr. Adams was employed as a traveling salesman.

[On] Sept. 21, 1892, he married Miss Mary E. Gray of this city. The ceremony was performed at the bride's home here.

Mr. Adams was an 82nd degree Mason and a member of the Shrine. He was a regular attendant of the All Souls Universalist church.

Besides his wife there survive one son, G. C. Adams of Albany and a brother, Charles F. Adams, Owego. There are also two grandchildren and an uncle, the latter of Chicago.

Funeral services will be held from the late home on Bowers avenue Wednesday at 2 p. m., the Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, pastor of All Souls Universalist church, will officiate, assisted by members of the Watertown Masonic Blue Lodge, No. 49. Interment will follow in Brookside cemetery.
