JOHN JESSUP AIKEN.

John Jessup Aiken, of 131 Warren street, died at 11 o'clock Monday morning following a five days' illness of pneumonia, aged 57 years. His death came suddenly and unexpectedly after a comfortable night.

The deceased was a life-long resident of Hudson and for the past thirty-five years had served as a trainman on the New York Central railroad. He was very popular in firemanic circles an exempt member of Rogers Hose Co. No. 2. He was a man who always had the best interests of his native city at heart, a citizen of the highest type. He was a member of the Universalist church.

He is survived by his sister, Jennie A. Aiken, with whom he resided, and one brother, Arthur L. Aiken, also of this city. A nephew, Arthur Aiken, is with the wireless department of Uncle Sam's forces "somewhere in France."
