## J. HENRY ALDOUS PASSES AFTER EXTENDED ILLNESS

J. Henry Aldous, 74, passed away Saturday evening at his home on Judson Street after an illness of over six months. He suffered a stroke in January. The funeral services will be held at the home Tuesday with James M. Payson [Universalist] officiating. The Masonic service will be used at the grave. Burial will take place in Evergreen Cemetery.

Mr. Aldous was born on the outskirts of Canton Nov. 18, 1859, the son of the late James and Mary Aldous. He spent all but ten years of his life around Canton. Shortly after marrying Miss Nettie Martin, of Crary Mills, who survives him, he moved to Watertown where he was superintendent of the Jefferson County Farm for ten years. After returning to Canton he occupied a farm on the Brick Chapel road for seventeen years. He moved to the residence at 70 Judson Street four years ago on retiring as a farmer.

Mr. Aldous was a member of the Masonic organization for forty years. He also was a member of the Silas Wright Grange, and of the Watertown Odd Fellows. Besides his widow, Mr. Aldous leaves two brothers, Ellsworth E. Aldous, Canton, and Charles Aldous, Morley road; on sister, Mrs. Zetta Noble, Evanston, Ill.
