MRS. CARROLL ALDOUS DIES

DeKalb Junction—Mrs. Irene M. Aldous, 70, wife of Carroll F. Aldous, died Thursday at 7:20 p.m. at the House of the Good Samaritan, Watertown, where she had been a patient since Jan. 10. She had been ill since Dec. 25, when she was admitted to the Edward John Noble Hospital, Canton.

The funeral will be Sunday at 2 p.m. at the Denesha Funeral Home, Rev. Max Coats, pastor of the Canton Unitarian-Universalist Church, officiating. Spring burial will be in Eddy Cemetery.

Friends may call at the funeral home tonight and Saturday afternoon and evening. Hermon Chapter 108, O.E.S. will conduct rites at the funeral home Saturday at 8 p.m.

Besides her husband, she is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Earl (Patricia) Dunkelberg, Canton; two sisters, Mrs. George (Ida) Karn, Morley, Mrs. Gerry (Mildred) Fillmore, Watertown, and two grandchildren.

Born Dec. 14, 1899, at Tampico, Ill., a daughter of Milton and Clara Gould Palmer, she attended Illinois schools and moved with her family to Watertown at an early age. She was graduated from Watertown High School and was married to Carroll F. Aldous on Dec. 25, 1926, at the home of her sister Mrs. Fillmore. The couple lived in Watertown until 1931, when they moved to Canton and Mr. Aldous operated a garage on Riverside Drive. He later worked at the Jones and Laughlin Steel Corp. The couple moved to their present address in 1958.

Mrs. Aldous was a member of the Canton Unitarian-Universalist Church Women's Federation, Hermon Chapter 108, O.E.S., and the DeKalb Craft Club.
