—Mrs. Harriet Ann Algate, aged 80 years, wife of John B. Algate, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Elgin Wilkinson, 226 Goodale street, Watertown, Wednesday evening at 11, following an accident that she sustained Monday, Oct. 15, at the home of her daughter. Mrs. Algate had been in failing health for the past three years, and several times suffered from slight shocks. The accident Monday hastened her death. She had started to go into the bath room of her late home when she was suddenly stricken with dizziness and fell to the floor. It is thought by the attending physicians, Drs. H. A. Pawling and H. C. Montgomery, that she sustained a fracture of the right thigh. Mrs. Algate was born in Orwell, Oswego Co., July 28, 1837, the daughter of Noah and Emily Damon. Her early life was spent in the place of her birth. She then removed to Henderson, at which place she remained up to two years ago, when she went to live in Watertown with her daughter, Mrs. Wilkinson. Mrs. Algate was married in Henderson to John B. Algate, who survives her. Her grandfather, Noah Damon, fought in the Revolutionary war, and her husband in the Civil war. She was a member of the Universalist church at Henderson and the W.C.T.U. Besides her husband, John B. Algate of Washington, D. C, she is survived by four sons, H. W. and A. L. Algate of Henderson, Ward of Washington, D. C, and Roy of Watertown; one daughter, Mrs. Elgin Wilkinson, of Watertown; three grandchildren, John D. of Washington, Miss Nina B. and Gaylord Algate of Henderson; two sisters, Mrs. Julia Penney of Henderson and Mrs. Elizabeth Merrian of Watertown. The funeral was held from the home of her daughter, at 226 Goodale street at 10:30 Friday morning, Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, pastor of All Souls Universalist church officiating. Mr. Algate was unable to attend the funeral because of his crippled condition. He sustained injuries by being run down in an automobile accident last May. The interment was made in the family lot at Roberts Corners.
