DEATHS.

In Newport, Herkimer county, on the 15th inst., Mrs. *Lydia*, consort of Mr. Isaac Allen, in the 63d year of her age. In the death of Mrs. Allen, her husband has lost an affectionate and kind companion, her children and grand children an amiable and tender mother, society one of its brightest ornaments, and the poor and afflicted a sympathizing and helping friend.
