MRS. CECELIA M. ANDREWS
DIES AFTER BREAKING LEG

Mrs. Cecelia M. Andrews, aged 84 years, widow of Henry Andrews, died at the home of her daughters, the Misses Julia M. and Grace L. Andrews, of No. 624 State street, at an early hour Friday morning.

Mrs. Andrews had been confined to her bed for the past seven weeks, having fractured her leg at that time. Since then she had failed and her condition had been regarded as serious. Prior to her recent illness she had been in excellent health for a woman of her years.

Mrs. Andrews was born in Depauville, July 8, 1839, the daughter of the late Samuel and Julia Ball Payne. During the first years of her girlhood she resided in Depauville, later moving to St. Lawrence. On March 2, 1874 she was united in marriage to the late Henry Adams.

Following their marriage Mr. and Mrs. Andrews moved to South Rutland where they lived for many years. Mr. Andrews passed away in 1895 and two years later Mrs. Andrews with her two daughters came to this city. They have since resided here.

Surviving Mrs. Andrews are her two daughters, Miss Grace L. and Miss Julia Andrews, both of this city; two grandchildren, Elizabeth and Jane Andrews of Rochester, and one brother, Adelbert Payne of this city.

Funeral services will be held from the residence in State street on Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, pastor of All Souls Universalist Church, which Mrs. Andrews attended, officiating. Burial will be made in the family plot in Brookside Cemetery.
