MISS MARY E. ANDREWS

Miss Mary E. Andrews, one of Webster's best known women, died Wednesday afternoon, November 24th, in her home in Main street, from injuries received from a fall she sustained the previous Thursday night, as she was leaving the Presbyterian church, where she had attended a supper. Her injuries consisted of a compound fracture and dislocation of the left ankle. Every medical attention was given her but she could not rally from the shock.

Miss Andrews was born July 8, 1840, in Orange, Steuben county, and for the past seventy years had been a resident of Webster. Up to the time of her accident, she had been actively engaged in mercantile business in the village, for the past thirty years. She was an active member of the W.C.T.U. and of the Universalist church.

She leaves one brother, Willis, of Egypt [Monroe Co.], five nieces, Mrs. Estella Witmer, who has made her home with Miss Andrews for several years; Miss Olive Andrews of Bolivar; Ruth and Mary Andrews of Egypt; three nephews, Lawrence, Charles and Harold Andrews of Egypt. The funeral was held Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the house and at 2:30 o'clock from the Universalist Church, Rev. Donald Fraser officiating. Burial made in the Webster Rural cemetery.
