CONESUS NOTES

In the death of Alanson B. Annis the town of Conesus loses an honorable and upright citizen, and the bereaved family a kind, indulgent husband and father. Mr. Annis had been something of an invalid the greater portion of his life, and at times suffered a great deal, but he bore his afflictions with fortitude and was ever kind and courteous towards all with whom he came in contact. In politics he was a sterling Republican. He was elected justice of the peace in 1857, and discharged the duties of that position for twelve years in an entirely satisfactory manner. He was a well informed man, being a great reader. The deceased had an abiding faith in the teachings of Universalism and did much to support the Universalist society at this place. He will be missed by his large circle of friends. The funeral was held at the late residence of the deceased on Saturday afternoon. The Rev. H. [Herbert] P. Morrell of Rochester delivered a very impressive and appropriate sermon.
