MRS. ANTHONY SUCCUMBS AT BUFFALO HOME

Former Resident of Fort Plain Was Accomplished
Musician and Church Organist for Over 20 Years

FORT PLAIN, Oct. 19—Mrs. Blanche Anthony, 73, widow of Jacob Anthony and a former well-known resident of this village, died suddenly at her home in Buffalo early Saturday morning. Death was due to heart disease.

Mrs. Anthony was born in Fort Plain September 29, 1864, a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Cornelius Garlock. She lived in this community for many years and after her marriage resided in Albany. Upon the death of her husband about eight years ago she moved to Buffalo and had since made her home in that city and Syracuse.

She was graduated from the Clinton Liberal Institute at Fort Plain in 1883 with high honors in music and had practiced that profession until the time of her sudden death. Mrs. Anthony, organist at the local Universalist Church for 22 years, was an ardent worker in all church activities.

Surviving are one son, J. Gardener Anthony, Buffalo; one sister, Mrs. Crawford [Mattie] Shults, Fort Plain; one niece, Mrs. Laura Whyland, Fort Plain; and one nephew, Harry Shults, Dolgeville.

The body was brought here and funeral services were held at the Catherine Nellis Memorial Chapel at 2 o'clock this afternoon. The Rev. William A. Haney, minister of the Universalist Church, officiated and interment was in Fort Plain Cemetery.
