Mrs. Hattie Taber Armour, funeral services for whom were conducted in the home on Washington street, on Friday afternoon, July 19th, was the oldest daughter of Francis M. and Susan Robinson Taber. She was born March 26, 1869, on the farm located on the upper Reservation road, where her early life was spent.

She was united in marriage to Alexander M. Armour on February 17, 1898. One son, Frank A. Armour, was born to them. Mrs. Armour was graduated from the Perry high school in 1889 and during the following years she studied art at Buchtel College, Akron, O. For many years she was a member of the Universalist church of Perry. She was a charter member of Castile Grange and served as the second lecturer of that organization. She was active in Grange affairs and was a member of the degree team for many years. Mrs. Armour introduced the printed programs which the Grange has never been without since. She was also a member of Castile Chapter O.E.S., serving in all capacities and filling the office of Matron for one year. Members of the Chapter attended the funeral in a body. Mr. and Mrs. Armour moved to this village in 1910 where they have since resided.

Interment was in Hope cemetery, Perry. The bearers were Henry Wilson, J. L. Fuller, F. W. Shumaker, H. J. Harrison, Germain Smith and Warren Loomis.
