Death of C. H. Arnold

Bemus Point, June 5—Charles H. Arnold, a prominent farmer near this place, was found dead Friday evening in his garden where he had been working. [He] Failing to come home to supper his wife went out to look for him. She found him lying face down. In one hand he held some melon seeds and in the other a hoe. He had evidently been dead since shortly after noon. Death was due to heart failure.

The funeral was held from the Bemus Point Universalist church at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon, attended by a host of sorrowing friends who crowded the entire church. Rev. J. G. Townsend of Jamestown officiated. Interment was made in the Bemus Point cemetery [cemetery]. Mr. Arnold was of a kind hearted and genial disposition and was greatly loved by all who knew him. He was 53 years of age and is survived by a wife.
