MRS. EDITH L. ASBY

CAMDEN—Mrs. Edith L. Asby, 45 Miner Ave., died Saturday in the Oneida City Hospital where she had been a patient for four weeks, following an illness of three months.

A native of Williamstown, she was born Sept. 4, 1880, a daughter of Henry C. and Hannah Marshall Case. She attended Williamstown schools and when a young woman of 20 went to Racine, Wisc., and was married to Richard Asby, about 40 years ago.

Mr. Asby died [in] Dec. 1948 and after his death she resided in Racine until last fall when she came to Camden, and with her sister, resided at 45 Miner Ave.

Mrs. Asby was a member of the Universalist Church of Racine, and was active in the church societies.

Surviving are three sisters, Miss Ida Case, Williamstown; Mrs. Patrick Hale, Williamstown, and Miss Elena Case, Camden; one nephew Wilferd [sic] Marshall Jr., Texas; one niece Mrs. James Finnerty, Williamstown, and another niece, Mrs. Marion Donlin, Syracuse; one brother-in-law, Wilfred J. Marshall, Racine.

The body was taken to Waterville by J. Floyd Smith this morning to be cremated and sent to Racine for burial in Mound Cemetery at Racine.
