Lynn E. Austin

After an illness of less than a week, caused by pneumonia, Lynn E. Austin, of Dolgeville, died at 1 Wednesday morning at the Herkimer hospital.

Mr. Austin was born September 20, 1892 in Middlesprite, being a son of Charles J. Austin and the late Eliza Covell Austin. Most of his life was spent in Dolgeville, where he was employed by the Daniel Green company. He was married September 25, 1912, to Grace Timmerman. He was a past noble grand of Dolgeville lodge of the Odd Fellows and was a member of the installing staff of District Deputy Mosher of that place, and financial secretary of the Dolgeville lodge. Mr. Austin was also a member of the Universalist church, the Rebekah lodge and the Modern Woodmen[,] and served for eight years as an active member of the Spofford Hose company. He was a man of exemplary habits, a good citizen and a popular resident, whose untimely death causes much sorrow.

Besides his wife, he is survived by his father; by a sister, Miss Gladys Austin of Dolgeville, and by three brothers, Howard and Carl of Dolgeville and James of Gloversville.

The funeral will be held from the Universalist church, Dolgeville, at 2 P.M. Saturday, Rev. C. [Clinton] A. Moulton officiating, and will be in charge of the Odd Fellows. Burial will be made in the Dolgeville cemetery.
