MRS. J. BACH DIED SUDDENLY
Rupture of a Blood Vessel Cased Her death in a Few Hours.

Mrs. Jean Bach, a well known and respected resident of this city, died rather suddenly about 1 o'clock Wednesday afternoon at her home, No. 33 Green street. She was taken ill a short time previous, a blood vessel near the heart having been ruptured. Her death was a shock to her many friends and relatives as she had been in her usual good health before she was stricken.

Mrs. Bach was a widow, her husband having died some time ago. She was friendly and sociable and had that goodness of heart which won the kind regard and esteem of her neighbors and circle of acquaintances. She was a member of the First Universalist church, and took an active part in religious work and everything that pertained to the welfare of the church. Her death is deeply regretted.

Two sons and three daughters survive her. They are Fred of Catskill, Alfred H. of this city, Mrs. Carrie Smith of Binghamton, and Cornelia and Bertha of this city. She also leaves six sisters and a brother—Mrs. Philip Seth, Mrs. John McEvoy, Mrs. William L. Parmenter, Mrs. I. L. Parrott, Mrs. W. F. Rooney, Miss Kate Schiffer and W. Henry Schiffer, all of this city.
