BACON

Charlotte Macomber Bacon, wife of A. G. Bacon, died at the noon hour Thursday, suddenly of heart disease, aged 74 years. She was married to Goodale Bacon on March 6, 1856. They began life together on Mr. Bacon's farm at West Perry, where they had lived continuously for fifty-two years. During the past winter they purchased a residence in the village, and had just gotten settled in their new home on Lake street.

Mrs. Bacon was the oldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Allen Macomber, who were among the pioneer residents of the town of Perry, and was born in the town of Perry. Deceased's mother [Esther Howe Macomber] died last July at the age of 95. Mrs. Bacon was a life long member of the Universalist church, a woman endowed by nature with a disposition that won and held friends all her lifetime, and was the embodiment of Christian virtues. Besides her husband she is survived by one daughter, Adelaide, two sisters, Mr. Hart and Mrs. Hattie Macomber, one brother Lewis A. Macomber, all residents of Perry.

The funeral was held Sunday afternoon from the family home, Rev. Clara Morgan officiating. Miss Blanchard sang, "Thy will be done" and "Good Night." The interment was in the family plot at West Perry.
