MRS. BAKER DIES AT 84

Jane A. Eason Baker, widow of the late Norman Baker, died at her home on the Canadarago Lake road on Sunday, February 22nd, after a long illness. The funeral was held at the home on Wednesday at one o'clock, the Rev. Mr. Kramer of Cooperstown officiating, and interment was made at Schuyler Lake.

Jane A. Eason was the daughter of Otis and Abby Weeden Eason, born in Oswego on August 30, 1835. In 1845 she removed to Newport, and in 1858 she came to Richfield Springs. Her marriage to Norman Baker took place in 1865. There survive three sons, Herbert of Manhattan, Montana, and Herman and Homer of this village; two grandchildren, Harold Baker of Manhattan, Montana and Norman Baker of this village; four stepchildren, Mrs. Henry O. Eason of Schuyler Lake, Mrs. Wallace Starr, Mrs. Frank C. Hyde, and Howard Baker; two brothers, William Eason of Muskegon, Mich., and Henry Eason of Schuyler Lake.

The deceased was a member of the Universalist Church, which she attended both in this village and in Schuyler Lake.
