Mrs. Charles D. Baldwin

Mrs. Fanny M. Baldwin, wife of Charles D. Baldwin of Detroit and for twenty-eight years a resident of Cortland, was buried in Groton last Saturday. Mrs. Baldwin was in poor health before they moved to Detroit some two and one-half years ago and the change was made to be nearer their son Herman who was living there. Her health continued to fail tho' everything possible was done to restore her health and make her more comfortable. The end came Wednesday, Nov. 7, at a hospital where it was necessary to send her that she might have constant care. She was 64 years of age. The funeral was held at the home in Detroit on Friday.

Mr. and Mrs. Baldwin were married in Locke, her former home and [they] resided there seven years before coming to Cortland. During their long residence here she was a regular and sincere worker in the Universalist church and in its Ladies' Aid society. She was a most estimable and public spirited woman and had a constantly increasing circle of friends.

Her husband and two sons survive, Herman of Detroit and Charles L. who has been in the regular army the past three years and is now with the 126th regiment at Waco, Texas. She also leaves three brothers.
