C. Neal Barney, 73, Pump Firm Executive, Dies

SCARSDALE—C. Neal Barney, vice president, secretary and general counsel of the Worthington Pump and Machinery Corporation, 2 Park Avenue, New York City, and a former Mayor of Lynn, Mass., died of a cerebral hemorrhage yesterday in his home here at 15 Barclay Road. He was seventy-three.

A Scarsdale resident for the last 25 years, Mr. Barney formerly was president of the Edgemont Association, a civic organization here.

Born in Lynn, Mr. Barney obtained a Bachelor of Arts degree from Tufts College, Medford, Mass., in 1895 and a law degree from Boston University three years later. He received his master's degree from Tufts in 1908 and was trustee of that college from 1909 to 1922. Later he was a lecturer at the law schools of both Northeastern and Boston Universities.

A Republican, Mr. Barney was Mayor of Lynn in 1906 and 1907. He was a Presidential elector in 1908 and an unsuccessful candidate for U.S. Representative from Massachusetts in 1916. He served as a lega advisor to the Lynn draft board in World War I.

Mr. Barney had been associated with the Worthington corporation since 1918.

At his death Mr. Barney was chairman of the board of trustees of the Church of the Divine Paternity, New York City, of the Universalist denomination. He was president of the Maria Mitchell Association, Nantucket, Mass., a member of the Society of Mayflower Descendants, the Newcomen Society, the Pacific and University Clubs.

His wife, Mrs. Maizie Blaikie Barney, and a daughter, Miss Virginia Barney, both of Scarsdale, survive.
