D. C. Barney, Prominent Whitesville Man Dead

WHITESVILLE, N.Y., Aug 19.—Whitesville lost one of its most esteemed, respected and honorable citizens Saturday when Delwin C. Barney, 87, died peacefully at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Lee Heselton. He had been ill for 3 weeks. His wife, also one of Whitesville's most respected and useful residents, died several years ago.

He was born in West Union January 9, 1855, the son of Darwin and Maria Horton Barney. He married Miss Susie Hall of Hallsport January 4, 1885. She died in 1922.

Mr. Barney was graduated from Mansfield State college in 1876 and attended Alfred university for a time. He was a member of the Universalist church of Whitesville and served for many years on the Whitesville board of education. He served several terms as a justice of the peace and was an active member of the former Cyclone Hose company. He was a farmer and owned and operated a saw mill and woodshop. He spent his entire life in this locality.

Surviving are 4 sons, Mason H. Barney of International Falls, Minn., Milan M. Barney of West Union, Harry L. Barney of Copley, Ohio, and Howard H. Barney of Whitesville; 2 daughters, Mrs. Mary Coats of Whitesville and Mrs. Lee Heselton of Paynesville; 4 grandchildren; 6 great grandchildren; one brother, Hiram Barney of Whitesville.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon from the home of his son, Howard H. Barney at 2:30 p.m. Rev. Louis P. Chastain of the Methodist church officiated and burial was in Rural cemetery.
