NATIVE SARATOGIAN F. A. BARRETT DEAD

Word has been received here of the death on July 27th at Newtonville, Mass., of Frederick Arms Barrett, a native Saratogian, son of the late Mr. and Mrs. A. R. Barrett. After attending the local public schools, Mr. Barrett began his career as a printer in The Saratogian office. He removed to Boston, where he became an expert linotype operator, working on the "Boston Globe" for over twenty-five years, and of late years on the "Herald."

He married Miss Fannie Leavitt of Newtonville in 1895. Mr. Barrett was a man of stirling [sic] worth and nobility of character, his friends will recall. He held the offices of deacon and trustee in the Universalist church. His love for music found gratification in the city concerts.

He was very active and took great enjoyment in his vegetable garden of half an acre. His sudden death of pneumonia was a great shock to his associates. He leaves to mourn his loss a wife, three children[,] three sisters, Mrs. Louisa Potter of Chicago, Addie Frary of Bernardston, Miss Orrie Barrett of Saratoga Springs, and two brothers, John Barrett of Los Angeles, and Charles Barrett of Vermilion, South Dakota.

The funeral was held from the late residence, 91 Washington Park, Newtonville. Dr. George H. Huntley of Cambridge, National Superintendent of the Universalist Sunday Schools, officiated. Burial was in the Newton cemetery.
