City Woman Dies at 86

Mrs. Elizabeth A. Barrington, formerly of 254 Chestnut St., died at 8:50 p.m. Wednesday—the day after her 86th birthday—in the House of the Good Samaritan, where she had been a patient since April 7. Death was attributed to infirmities of old age.

Mrs. Barrington, mother of Beaumont Thomas, 254 Chestnut St., vice president of the Stebbins Engineering & Manufacturing Co., was a patient in an Academy Street nursing home for about two years before entering the hospital.

A private funeral at the convenience of the family will be held Saturday afternoon at 2:30 at the Cleveland-McCallen Funeral Home. Rev. Weston Stevens, pastor of the All Souls Universalist Church, will officiate. Burial will be in Brookside Cemetery.

Friends may call at the funeral home Friday night from 7 to 9.

Surviving her, besides her son, are two grandchildren, Barry F. Thomas and Mrs. Nicholas D. (Nancy Thomas) Morgia, Watertown, and five great-grandchildren.

The widow of T. Allen Barrington, she had lived here for 25 years.

She was born in Wales May 5, 1884, a daughter of Zachariah and Betsy Lewis. She was married twice. Her first husband, John Alexander Thomas of Wales, to whom she was married in 1907, died in Wales in 1911.

She was married to T. Allen Barrington of England in Wales in 1924 and they came to this country in 1927.

Mr. and Mrs. Barrington lived in West Virginia and later in Cleveland, O., where he died in 1945. Following his death, she came to this city to live with her son.
