George Edward Beadle

The death of George Edward Beadle, which occurred at his home on Susquehanna avenue late Tuesday night, removes a citizen of fine intelligence and integrity, a printer of the old school who for the greater part of his long life had been identified with Coopertown printing offices. Mr: Beadle was born in Pierstown February 15, 1843, and was the son of Hosea and Amy Beadle. He became an apprentice in the office of the Freeman's Journal, under the ownership of Samuel M. Shaw, at the age of sixteen. For about fifteen years past he had been an advertising compositor in the plant of the Arthur H. Crist Co., where he was held in high esteem by both employers and employe[e]s. In January last he was obliged by failing health to give up work at the type case where he had spent so many pleasant and productive years.

On May 1, 1908, Mr. Beadle was married to Clarissa Barbara Thayer, who survives him together with three children, George Henry Beadle of Cooperstown, Mrs. Alexander Schultze of Troy and Walter E. Beadle of Cooperstown. The funeral will be held at his late home Friday afternoon at 2 o'clock, the Rev. Charles Kramer of the Universalist church officiating. Interment will be made in Lakewood cemetery.
