Mr. [William S.] Goodell, of Mexico, formerly pastor of the Universalist church in this place, was selected by her some years ago to preach her funeral sermon and in accordance with her request he was present and fulfilled his promise he had made her, Rev. L. [Lewis] B. Fisher assisting in the services. The funeral was held at the residence of her son Marshall and was attended by a large concourse of people. Her remains were interred at Riverside Cemetery at this place.
