OBITUARY

BENNETT

Miss Zadie Bennett passed away in the Thompson Memorial Hospital in Canandaigua Saturday evening November 1st after many years of illness. She was born in Duanesburg, N. Y. 84 years ago and when 21 years old came with her parents Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Bennett to East Bloomfield. About 56 years ago the family came to Victor township and located on the Bickford farm, now the Herman Boughton farm. For many years past Miss Bennett's home had been on the Victor-Bushnell's Basin road a short distance west of Lane's Corners.

Miss Bennett followed the profession of nursing and was a very efficient practical nurse. Those who were ministered unto by her called her again and again to their aid in times of illness and all of the children in some Victor families were cared for by her in their infancy. During her last years of active work she was office assistant to Dr. A. M. Mend. Sixteen years ago she was struck by an automobile while walking from this village to her home and the injuries received incapacitated her for further work. She had been confined to her bed for nine years during which time she had been cared for by Mr. and Mrs. John Garling in the house in which had long been her home. About three weeks ago it became necessary because of her increased helplessness to remove her to the hospital. She was a member of St. Paul's Universalist church. The surviving relatives are a niece and a nephew, Mrs. Frank Boughton and Frank Haney, both of Victor.

Funeral services were held from the home of Mrs. Boughton Tuesday afternoon, the Rev. Nelson L. Lobdell officiating. Burial was made in the Rice cemetery in East Bloomfield near the former Bennett home.
