Scott S. Berry

At an early hour Thursday morning, at his home in Stockwell, occurred the death of Scott S. Berry, after an illness of about a week. The news of his death was received in this village as a shocking surprise and general regret was expressed.

Scott S. Berry was born in Stockwell fifty-four years ago and had always lived there, being engaged in farming and market gardening. He had not been in very good health for several months, complaining of queer noises in his head. Last Thursday he went out to his little shop near the house to take a nap and there he was found soon after, evidently suffering from a stroke of apoplexy. Everything possible was done, but he only partially regained consciousness, and after answering a few questions in a disjointed manner, he again lapsed into unconsciousness, which lasted until he died.

About thirty-five years ago he married Alta Gleason, and together they had lived their life in the community in which he was born and where he had earned the love and respect of his neighbors by his unfailing kindliness of disposition and ready help in times of need. Besides his wife, Mr. Berry is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Allen Webb, and his aged mother, Mrs. Sarah Clark Berry, both of whom reside in this town.

The funeral will be held on Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock from his late residence, Rev. Mr. Frasier, the Universalist minister at Madison, officiating, and interment will be made in the Stockwell cemetery.
