FATHER OF MRS. HARRY J. YODER DIES IN SYRACUSE

Mrs. Harry J. Yoder, 246 Ten Eyck street, was called to Syracuse Thursday evening by the sudden death of her father, James M. Betts, 67, of that city. Mrs. Yoder was accompanied to Syracuse by Mr. Yoder, secretary of the W. W. Conde Hardware company, and their two children.

Mr. Betts died suddenly at his home in Syracuse, 322 Baker avenue. He had been in ill health for some time and under the care of a physician. He was able to be about the city, however, and Thursday made two trips down town.

For many years Mr. Betts was employed in the Syracuse post office there as a mechanic. He was well known there, where his brother, Rev. Dr. F. W. Betts, is pastor of the First Universalist church.

Surviving besides Mrs. Yoder and Dr. Betts are his widow, Mrs. Alice Mosley Betts of Syracuse; a sister, Mrs. Harriet C. Thompson of Onondaga Hill; another brother, B. F. Betts of Cleveland, Ohio, and two grandchildren, Clayton Betts Yoder and Elizabeth Yoder of Watertown.

Mr. Betts was a life-long resident of Syracuse. He was a member of his brother's church, the First Universalist. Funeral Sunday afternoon from the home, 322 Baker avenue, Syracuse.
