Peck [Universalist], took place on the 2d inst., at the home of the deceased on Elm street, amid a large circle of sorrowing friends and relatives, who have our heartfelt sympathy, and our prayers that they may one day meet the loved one in that land that is free from sickness, sorrow and death.
