MRS. EMOGENE BLISS

The death of Mrs. Jerome E. Bliss in Dolgeville on June 21 at the age of 102 years, seven and one-half months, takes from the village one of its loved and most charming persons. She suffered a stroke a week before her death and the decline was rapid.

She was born in Lotsville, November 6, 1846, the daughter of William and Eliza Cramer. Until her marriage she resided in Lotsville. She was married to Jerome E. Bliss on January 1, 1866. In 1885, they moved to the house which she occupied until her death. Mr. Bliss died in 1913. There were two children: Mrs. Edward [Maggie] Youker of Dolgeville and Mrs. George [Matilda] Braybrook, deceased; three grandchildren, Bliss J. Youker of Buffalo, Robert J. Youker of Brooklyn and Mrs. Grover C. [Emma Jean] Luther of Dolgeville. Mrs. Bliss made her home with Mr. and Mrs. Grover C. Luther and they did their utmost for the comfort and happiness of their grandmother. There are also two great grandsons and several nieces and nephews.

Mrs. Bliss was a loyal and active member of the Universalist Church, until her infirmities prevented her from regular church attendance. She was a member of the Col. William Feeter Chapter of the D.A.R. Her interest in politics was always lively and she voted at every election, even in the last general election.

The memorial service was conducted in the Luther home by the Rev. Clinton A. Moulton.
