Levi J. Bliss died yesterday at his home in East German street. Mr. Bliss had been in ill health for some time, having for several years been deprived of his eyesight yet withal bearing his affliction with Christian patience. He was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. John R. Bliss and was born November 19, 1842 in the town of German Flatts. He followed the occupation of farming before coming to Herkimer in 1889 and had employment here with the Herkimer Paper Mill and Contractor John H. Nelson and for several years was caretaker at Oak Hill Cemetery. His last position was with Clark A. Miller, late of Herkimer, being obliged because of his failing health to give this position up. The wife and one daughter, Cora E. Bliss, and one son, John R. Bliss of this village, are surviving, and also two sisters, Mrs. M. D. Easton of Mohawk and Mrs. William Klock of Columbia, and also several nephews and nieces. The funeral service will be held at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon from his late home, the Rev. Charles E. Bingham [Universalist] officiating and interment will be made in Oak Hill Cemetery.
