JAMES BOGART, RETIRED, DIES VERY SUDDENLY  
Former Business Man Dies from Shock—Had Just Returned from Calls

.James C. Bogart, aged 73, of No. 19 Jay street, died at his home about 7 o'clock this morning, following a shock [stroke] which he suffered last night between 9 and 10 o'clock. Mr. Bogart passed the evening out, calling upon some neighbors, and suffered the shock shortly after his return to his home at 9 o'clock. Prior to his illness he was in good health and had been down to the square twice during the day.

He was born in Alexandria, December 29, 1848, son of Henry and Jeanett Bogart. He passed his early life in that village and learned the cheese making trade there.

During his early manhood he moved to Gouverneur, where he made cheese in a factory near that village. Shortly after that he moved to Hammond, where he owned and operated a farm.

He moved to this city about 31 years ago and opened a drug store in the old Taggart building which stood where the present Chamber of Commerce building is. He operated this store about 15 years and then sold out to B. A. Littlefield, who operated the store until the time of the burning of the Taggart block some few years ago.

At the time he disposed of his drug store he retired and has lived in Jay street since.

He was married twice. His first wife, Mary Everson of Alexandria Bay, whom he married [in] September, 1870, died in April, 1898. He was married to Lillian Gordon of this city, October 4, 1905.

He is survived by his wife; one son, Dr. Charles Bogart of Troy; one granddaughter, Mrs. Richard Kalbfus of Detroit; one brother, former Sheriff John H. Bogart of Theresa; three nephews, Dean George Bogart, dean of the law college at Cornell university, and Floyd and Fred White of Redwood, and three nieces, Dr. Jean Bogart of Detroit, Mrs. Harry Stone of this city and Mrs. Clark Schell of Theresa.

Funeral will be held from the home Monday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, D. D., pastor of the All Souls Universalist church, will officiate. Interment will be made in Brookside cemetery.
