DEATH OF MRS. A. BOND Mrs. Chloe A. Bond Passed on to The Higher Life Feb. 14, Aged Fifty-seven Years.

Mrs. Bond was born in Cattaraugus county, N.Y. Her father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Crosier, soon after returned to their native state, Vermont, and here her girlhood was passed. She was married when quite young to Mr. Safford Bassett and lived until the death of Mr. Bassett at Council Bluffs, Iowa. Mrs. Bassett was at this time 22 years of age, and had one daughter. She was afterwards married to Mr. [Charles] Bond whom she had known from childhood. Two sons and two daughters were born to them. They lived at Lehigh, Iowa until the death of Mr. Bond a few years ago [in 1890]. Soon after, Mrs. Bond and her two sons George and Charles and her youngest daughter May came to reside at Oakland, N.Y., where she had two brothers, Otis H. and Parker Crosier, and four sisters, Mrs. Wilson, Mrs. Fuller, Mrs. Marshall and Miss Clara Crosier.

Mrs. Bond soon after united with the Universalist church of Nunda, and has been a consecrated and zealous laborer in that household of faith.

When it was known that Mrs. Bond had had a stroke of paralysis with no hopes of recovery, a feeling of sadness pervaded the entire community. Already she had made so many frends that she seemed like an old acquaintance, as well as a cherished friend. Surrounded by her five children, her four sisters, and her brothers with their families, the last few days of her eventful life was [were] cheered by their presence. A sad but tender family reunion, Mrs. George W. Corey and Mrs. C. H. Churchill of Fort Dodge, Iowa, and George Bond of Lehigh, Iowa, her oldest children, were with here the last days of her earthly life. Calmly and peacefully she passed away.

Her funeral occurs to-day (Thursday) at 3 p.m., attended by her pastor, Rev. James Taylor.
