MRS. NELLIE LANG BOND DIES AT WINTER HOME
Had Spent Winter in Florida—Formerly Resided in Norwood

Mrs. Nellie Lang Bartlett Bond died at her winter home in Miami, Fla., Monday, May 15, following a long and severe illness.

Nellie Lang was born in Massena and received her early education at Norwood. She entered the Potsdam Normal school in 1878 and graduated from the classical course in 1883. In 1884 she married the late Charles L. Bartlett of this village. In 1892, following her husband's death, she became preceptress of the Norwood Union Free school. The following year she took a post graduate course in the Normal school and in 1894 opened a private school at Burlington, Vt. After conducting school there for a year, she returned to Potsdam and became principal of the intermediate department at the Normal and head of the geography methods department.

A short time later she was married to Professor Bond who taught in the mathematics department of the Normal. They remained in Potsdam until about three years ago when they moved to Professor Bond's old home near Canastota. They have been spending their winters in Florida for the past few years.

Mrs. Bond was a capable woman, active in the Fortnightly club and the Universalist church while residing in Potsdam. She was also a member of the editorial staff of the Normal magazine.

She is survived by her husband and one daughter, Miss Ruth Bartlett.

The body was taken to the home of relatives near Chittenango and funeral services held from there Saturday.
