DEATH OF MRS. I. W. BOSTWICK

Was a Daughter of John Windecker, and Born at Harrisburg October 14, 1823.

Mrs. Mariette Windecker Bostwick, relict of the late Isaac W. Bostwick, formerly of Lowville, and who had many old friends in Lewis county, died Tuesday at her home in Norwalk, O.

Mrs. Bostwick was born in Harrisburg, Lewis county, October 14, 1823. She was a daughter of the late John Windecker. [On] October 10th, 1848, at West Lowville, she was married to Isaac W. Bostwick, with whom she lived fifty-eight years, Mr. Bostwick passing away July 20th, 1901.

To Mr. and Mrs. Bostwick were born two sons and four daughters, Mrs. Mary R. Goodell, of Norwalk, being the only surviving child. In 1859 Mr. and Mrs. Bostwick moved from New York state to Ohio, settling at Norwalk, where they ever after made their home, and for forty-seven years they lived on East Seminary street, in the very house where they both died.

Aside from the daughter, Mrs. Goodell, among the many relatives of Mrs. Bostwick still living are two sisters, Mrs. H. L. Hill, of Ripon, Wis., and Mrs. Sedate Pier, of Wausau, Wis.; and two brothers, Sidney Windecker, of Fonddu Lac, Wis., and Sylvester Windecker, of Oak field, Wis. For half a century or more Mrs. Bostwick was a faithful member and constant attendant of the Universalist church, and no one of the members of that church ever gave it more loyal and faithful support.

The funeral services will be held tomorrow.
